# CAST ANNOUNCED FOR GEFFEN PLAYHOUSE WORLD PREMIERE OF "BLACK CYPRESS BAYOU"

LOS ANGELES (December 6, 2023) – Geffen Playhouse today announced the full cast for its world premiere of *Black Cypress Bayou*, written by **Kristen Adele Calhoun** (HBO's *Sula*, *BLKNWS*) and directed by **Tiffany Nichole Greene** (*Hamilton: An American Musical*, *Rent*).

The cast includes **Amber Chardae Robinson** (*Judas and the Black Messiah, 80 for Brady*) as **Taysha Hunter**; **Brandee Evans** (*P-Valley, The Fabulous Four*) as **LadyBird "Lady" Manifold; Angela Lewis**(*Snowfall, Milk Like Sugar*) as **RaeMeka "Meka" Manifold-Baler**; and **Kimberly Scott** (*Joe Turner's Come and Gone, Sweat*) as **Vernita Manifold**.

Previews for *Black Cypress Bayou* begin Wednesday, February 7, 2024, in the Audrey Skirball Kenis Theater at Geffen Playhouse. Opening night is Thursday, February 15, 2024.

On a hot summer night in Texas, Vernita Manifold summons her two daughters down to the bayou with a secret too big to keep. The richest, meanest man in town is dead, and the Manifold women know more than they're saying. As secrets begin to surface, the bonds between the women, their town, and the legacy of their ancestors all come to a head. *Black Cypress Bayou* is a hilarious, suspenseful world premiere about loyalty, healing, and comeuppance.

#### **Kristen Adele Calhoun (Playwright)**

Kristen Adele Calhoun is a writer, actor, producer, and curator. Her playwriting commissions include Penumbra Theatre, Lucille Lortel Theatre, the NAACP, St. Louis Black Repertory Company, 651 ARTS, and the Black American West Museum. Other plays include *WILDCAT*, blood work, Out the Mud, and Canfield

Drive. She is the co-curator of BLKSPACE, a two-week, rest-centered residency for Black artists and is currently an I AM SOUL Playwriting Resident at Dr. Barbara Ann Teer's National Black Theatre. Her film and television writing credits include: HBO's adaptation of Toni Morrison's novel Sula helmed by showrunner Shannon M. Houston and Stephanie Allain's Homegrown Pictures, and BLKNWS directed by Kahlil Joseph, produced by A24 and Participant. Kristen's television and film acting credits include: House of Cards, Orange Is the New Black, Elementary, Blue Bloods, The Good Wife, Everything I Whispered to Dorothy, and The Astronaut Who Lost His Helmet. A native of Dallas, Texas, she is a graduate of the University of North Texas (Bachelor of Fine Arts) and the Mason Gross School of the Arts at Rutgers University (Master of Fine Arts). Brandee's first career was as an educator. She held the Chair position of the English department in Memphis, her hometown. Brandee is also an accomplished dancer and choreographer—she has appeared in multiple music videos and has toured, danced, and created for artists all over the world.
