LOS ANGELES (January 26, 2022) – Geffen Playhouse today announced the full cast for its West Coast premiere of *TRAYF*, written by **Lindsay Joelle** (*The Messengers, The Garbologists*) and directed by **Maggie Burrows** (*Spacebar, Damsels*).

The cast includes **Ilan Eskenazi** (*Sing Street, Iron Fist*) as Zalmy, **Ben Hirschhorn** (*Closets Keep Suburban Boys Home, Practice Funeral*) as Shmuel, **Louisa Jacobson** (*The Gilded Age, Romeo and Juliet*) as Leah and **Garrett Young** (*Chicago Fire, Thicker Than Water*) as Jonathan.

Previews for *TRAYF* begin Tuesday, March 1 in the Audrey Skirball Kenis Theater at Geffen Playhouse. Opening night is Thursday, March 10.

Zalmy lives a double life. By day, he drives a Chabad "Mitzvah Tank" through 1990s New York City, performing good deeds with his best friend Shmuel. By night, he sneaks out of his orthodox community to roller-skate and listen to rock and roll. But when a curious outsider offers him unfettered access to the secular world, is it worth jeopardizing everything he's ever known? This road-trip bromance is a funny and heartwarming ode to the turbulence of youth, the universal suspicion that we don't quite fit in, and the faith and friends that see us through.

Lindsay Joelle (Playwright)

Lindsay Joelle is a Chicago-born, NYC-based playwright, librettist, and screenwriter whose writing explores the rituals, routines, jargon, and humor of micro-communities across America. Her critically acclaimed play *The Garbologists*, an EST/Sloan Foundation Science & Technology commission, recently received a co-world premiere at Philadelphia Theatre Company and is slated at City Theatre in spring 2022. Other plays include: *TRAYF* (Theater J, New Repertory Theatre, Penguin Rep), a Goldberg M.F.A. Playwriting Prize recipient; *A Small History of Amal, Age 7* (Forward Flux & Pratidhwani); and *The*

Messengers, an Audible Theatre Emerging Playwright Commission recorded by Audible. Joelle was the National New Play Network's Playwright-in-Residence at Curious Theatre and is a proud NNPN, New Georges, and American Theatre Wing affiliated artist. Alumna of the BMI Musical Theatre Workshop, Nashville Repertory Theatre's Ingram New Works Lab, Hunter Playwriting Program (M.F.A.), and Columbia University (B.A.). Maggie Burrows (Director)

Maggie Burrows is a theater and film director living in New York City. She has worked with Atlantic Theater Company, Playwrights Horizons, New York Theatre Workshop, WP Theater, Roundabout Theatre Company, Manhattan Theatre Club, Williamstown Theatre Festival, and the Geffen. She received her B.A. from Yale University, where she was a nominee for the Sudler Prize for Excellence in the Arts. She is a member of the Lincoln Center Directors Lab, the inaugural 2018-2019 BOLD Resident Director at Northern Stage, and the recipient of the 2018 Boris Sagal Directing Fellowship at Williamstown Theatre Festival. In 2020, in collaboration with the Roald Dahl Story Company, Maggie coconceived and produced *James and the Giant Peach with Taika and Friends* to benefit Partners in Health. Ilan Eskenazi (Zalmy)

Ilan Eskenazi is thrilled to be making his Geffen Playhouse debut. New York City born and raised, he is a graduate of Fiorello H. LaGuardia High School for Performing Arts and a recent graduate of Pace University with a B.F.A. in Acting. Most recently on stage in New York Theater Workshop's production of *Sing Street*, which was planned to debut on Broadway at the Lyceum Theater prior to the COVID-19 shutdown. Ben Hirschhorn (Shmuel)

Additionally, he was notably seen in the 2018 New York Stage and Film production of *As You Like It* as "Rosalind/Ganymede." You'll find Ben next playing the loveable "Malcolm" in the new Tupac inspired film *Amaru* (2022), which will have its world premiere at the Pan African Film Festival.
